


La Grande Sno Drifters are in high gear getting everything ready for the OSSA Convention!

Convention information

• Registration will be every evening Tuesday through Saturday at that evening's event. Registrants will receive a convention bag with their name badge/lanyard, dinner tickets, purchased merchandise ticket and other goodies inside.

• There will be a **hop-n-shop** snownopily for those that do not snowmobile. Our Chamber has lined up some of our downtown merchants and restaurants who will be providing discounts for convention attendees on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, you will need to show your name badge to receive any offered discounts. In your registration bag you will see the playing card. When visiting a participating merchant have your card stamped/punched at their location on the card. 



Last month we got a call at 5pm from a person who was stuck down in a ravine with 2 other snowmobilers. They had gone down a very steep slope and were unable to find another way out of the ravine. They had already called the local sheriff's department to request Search & Rescue, but were calling us to help coordinate as their phone was starting to go dead.

When we called the sheriff's department, we offered to assist but were told that they were "unable to dispatch us". Because the snowmobilers had contacted us directly, we went ahead and got 3 of our more experienced club members to respond.

Around 10pm we had located the 3 snowmobilers who were cold and exhausted. By 11:30pm we had all 3 back to the parking lot. We later found out that Search & Rescue had been called off until morning because it was too dark to safely search for the snowmobilers. Needless to say we had 3 very grateful snowmobilers that evening.






Rescue Sleigh







OSSA Public Lands & Safety Report by John Vogel

I have tried very hard to follow the President's agendas in keeping up the fight in keeping our riding areas open. I have been working with the Forest Service personnel to express our concerns about the future usage of our forests throughout the state. I have attended several zoom meetings in Oregon with our Congressmen and Senators trying to have a voice from the snowmobile community. It is a very challenging job when you don't have all your troops fighting with you. There is a large number of people who get very involved and fight the battle with you, but we need more troops to help in the battle of land closures. desired condition but are now claiming that their desired condition represents "the public's" desire for access to the mountains of Eastern Oregon, again, without any public input in the development of that desired condition.

Blues Intergovernmental Council

The Forest Service had requested a meeting with Forest Access For All (FAFA) to discuss the Forest Plan Revision of the Blues Mountain Forest area proposed by BIC. To our knowledge and looking at the news articles coming out we are seeing a pattern arise where the Forest Service is stating they will build from the commissioners "desired conditions" for access which is a closed forest system.

The FAFA has given formal notice to the US Forest Service regarding the Blues Intergovernmental Council (BIC) & the Desired Conditions the BIC has developed. The desired condition for access as currently written states that it is the public's desired condition to know what roads and areas are closed with a clear map, not to retain an open forest. The BIC did not review or consider public input in developing this

Dear Forest Supervisors,

After attending your BIC meetings from Nov. 25th through Dec. 9th our membership and leadership of Forest Access For All (FAFA) and Citizens for Balanced Use (CBU) have grave concerns about the BIC itself, the manner in which work products were developed, namely the desired conditions, and your adoption of those desired conditions from which to build upon for the forest plan revision. It looks to us that no lessons were learned from the past failures of the agency and that you are heading down the same path of not listening to our communities as happened in the last forest plan revision.




We had a nice gathering at our new groomer shed on New Years Eve with a bonfire and fireworks. Thanks to all who attended!







Volunteers that volunteer 16 hours or more qualify for a Northwest Forest Pass. Volunteer 250 hours or more to qualify for the America the Beautiful Volunteer Pass.

Annual Northwest Forest Pass

Benefits

- Honored at all Forest Service operated recreation sites in Washington and Oregon where a day use fee is required.
- Allows the pass holder use of recreation facilities at per-person sites. Other members in the party must pay the per-person fee.
- Allows the pass holder and any accompanying passengers in a private vehicle use of the recreation facilities at per vehicle sites.
- Passes are interchangeable between all members of the same household.
- Frequent visitors of national forests may save money by buying an annual pass.
- Reduces Forest Service administrative costs therefore allowing more dollars to go toward improvements at recreation sites.
- One free decal may be issued per Annual Northwest Forest Pass for visitors who have an open topped vehicle (Jeeps, etc.), or motorcycles. Decals are available at Forest Service offices only.

America the Beautiful Volunteer Pass

What are the benefits of the pass? The pass covers entrance and/or standard amenity fees on lands managed by the U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, Bureau of Reclamation, and Bureau of Land Management. Passes are valid for one year from the issuance date. More details about using the Volunteer Pass are at Recreation.gov.

How can I qualify for an America the Beautiful Volunteer Pass? Accrue 250 hours of volunteer service on participating Federal public lands, and you can receive an America the Beautiful Volunteer Pass in recognition of your efforts.

Simply coordinate tracking of your hours with OSSA and we can request the pass for you.

A snowmobile club volunteer is a special person who dedicates their time, energy, and sometimes money to benefit not only their snowmobile club but others. They voluntarily maintain over 31,500 miles of multi-use trail each year. These trails benefit not only snowmobilers but crosscountry skiers, snow bikers, snow-shoers, and dog sledders. In the spring and fall, volunteers are busy cleaning trails and putting up trail markers to get ready for the next season. They cut wood and fill the shelters for all to use. They build bridges, shelters, reroof existing grooming sheds, and do their own maintenance on their sno-cats. They voluntarily teach snowmobile safety classes and avalanche safety classes. They donate to charitable organizations such as Candlelighters, Wounded Warriors, Hospice, and Meals on Wheels just to name a few.

Our volunteers are the backbone of our organization. We could go on and on about all that they do. So, we want to humbly thank each and every one of you for your hard work and dedication to our wonderful organization.

Volunteer hours/miles = \$\$\$. More \$\$\$ = the more we can provide for snowmobiling!

We started the season off at our October club meeting by talking about the trail maintenance done this summer and any we may have missed. With the winter weather here we need to prepare our vehicles and our minds for this season and remember the four C's.

Here are the four C's of winter driving:

Check: Lights, Antifreeze, Tire wear, Tire pressure, Leaks, Battery, Brakes, Oil Change, Air Filter, and Tune-up.

Change: Winter Wiper Blades – The protective sleeve will help keep the blades on your windshield ice free. Winter Washer Fluid – De-icier washer fluid will make your life easier on those real bad days. Snow tires – Even if you have a 4 wheel drive vehicle, winter tires are your safest way of travel in bad weather. **Carry:** Carry these items in your trunk in a box or duffel bag. Jumper cables, Tire chains, Flashlight (with new batteries), Tire inflator, First aid kit, Flare and safety triangle, Protein bars, Bottled water, Snow brush with ice scraper, Blanket for every passenger, maps, paper towels, Work Gloves, and some basic tools.

Clean: Clean your vehicle and undercarriage of rocks and mud to protect your investment, Clean and wax your vehicle least once a week! Windshields, back window and side windows, headlights and tail lights.

Clean the snow from the top and hood of your car.
