

# The Oregon Snowmobile Community Lost A Fierce Advocate of Snowmobiling. Peggy Spieger Has Passed Away.

Peggy served as OSSA Executive Director for over 30 years. She made contributions as a trail and program developer for Oregon making it one of the best in the nation. She always took your call no matter the day or time. She was also active with the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA), the International Association of Snowmobile Administrators (IASA), Western Chapter of Snowmobile Associations, as well as her local snowmobile club. She was a volunteer leader at the club, state, national, and international level. Peggy fought for the rights of snowmobilers to access Crater Lake National Park and the Newberry National Volcanic Monument. She played an instrumental role in the development of Kapka Sno-Park. Peggy worked with the Oregon Department of Transportation to administer grooming and trail maintenance of Oregon's snowmobile trails. She was the voice for Oregon snowmobiling in Washington D.C.

Peggy has received many awards. In 2020, she was inducted into the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame and received the Iron Dog Brigade Distinguished Service Award.

Our deepest sympathy and heartfelt thoughts and prayers go out to the entire Spieger family. Peggy will be missed by all that knew her.

February 6, 2024 Avalanche Instructor: Mike Duffy Avalanche Rescue is a one-day standalone course covering the basics of companion rescue as well as the current best practices in rescue techniques and gear. Students will receive professional coaching on their rescue skills and timed practice with realistic scenarios. Thus, this course is intended for those new to the backcountry, but it should also be retaken on a regular basis to keep skills sharp and to stay up to date with advancing rescue techniques and technology. This course is recommended for anyone completing a Snowmobile Rec Level 1 course and it is a mandatory prerequisite for both the Rec Level 2 Avalanche Course and the Professional Level 1 Avalanche Course. We use an internationally vetted curriculum and state of the art knowledge from MountainSafety.info. The course meets the guidelines set forth by the American Avalanche Association.



### Vandals and Thieves Hit Two OSSA Clubs **Forest Shelters & Equipment Over Christmas/New Years Break**

Moon Country Snowbusters & La Pine Lodgepole Dodgers Offer Reward.

Vandalism of a snow shelter and destruction of avalanche equipment is threatening the safety of Central Oregon back country enthusiasts. Two local non profits are offering rewards for information that lead to the arrest of the vandals who they describe as "bottom feeding maggots."

Sometime over Christmas break, vandals broke glass, scrawled graffiti, discharged fire extinguishers and stole firewood from the Wanoga Shelter in the Wanoga Sno-Park near Mt. Bachelor. Damages are estimated around \$1,000.

"We'd like to catch these guys," said Justin Goodman, president of Moon Country Snowbusters. "We really think having these dirty rotten scoundrels walking around doing this kind of stuff to something that's provided by us and take it advantage of it. Unfortunately everybody else is going to miss out on it. We're hoping to get the word out to figure out who's behind this."

Also over the break, someone vandalized an avalanche beacon check station near Paulina Lake. The culprit knocked down the recently installed station, removed a solar panel, a battery and a circuit board.

"Whether you are snowshoeing, skiing, snowmobiling, hiking, you will typically go out in the back country with a beacon on your body," said Keith Walls, vice-president of Moon Country Snowbusters. "Those are used if there's an avalanche so your friends who are with you can find you and get you out. Those checkers are put in place to make sure your beacon is working as it should."

The Moon Country Snowbusters and the La Pine Lodgepole Dodgers snowmobile clubs are offering a \$450 reward (up from \$250) for information that leads to recovery of the missing equipment, or the arrest of, as they put it on their Facebook post, "the low-life bottom feeding maggots responsible for vandalizing public property that is maintained by volunteers."

The missing equipment consists of an approximately 24-inch square photovoltaic panel, a battery similar to a motorcycle battery in size and a printed circuit board that would fit in the open box in the pictures below. They ask people to keep an eye out for ads on Facebook Marketplace and Craigslist for the items who may be trying to sell or trade them.

On the Wanoga vandalism, you can contact the groups on Facebook Messenger — La Pine Lodgepole Dodgers or Moon Country Snowbusters — with any information. For the avalanche equipment, you can contact them or the Deschutes County Sheriff's Office.



### **Regular Monthly Meetings (subject to change)**

We had 30 members attend our December meeting with the Christmas exchange. December seems to have our best turn out.

### Poker Run February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024

We are adding the trail to our Poker Run this year. Entailing a combination (call it a hybrid) of both trail and walk-about. You can do the walk-about only if you wish. One of our long-time members has stepped up. He and his family are going to stand the 3 trail stations. The riders will be eligible for our normal \$3000 purse, but they will also be eligible for an additional purse of \$1000, divided 50%,30%,20%. Register Friday night or Saturday, however if you register for the trail, registration closes at 10am Saturday, if you register at 10am Saturday you will find it very difficult to complete your card. To be eligible for the trail purse the rider must have a Snowmobile License on their machine (cards will not be punched without a snowmobile license on their machine), ride to all 3 stations, and have their cards punched. The other 4 card draws are accomplished in town. A rider has the option to have their draws in town either before or after they ride the trail. A total of 7 draws will be accepted. Riders are responsible for getting their cards back to the schoolhouse (community center) by 2pm. It will probably take you between 2.5 to 3 hours to ride the trail. Manage your time carefully. Station times on the trail will be 8am to 1pm. Station times in town will be 8am to 1:30pm. You can register the night before, Friday Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> at schoolhouse (community center) from 6pm to 8pm (recommended for the trail) or Saturday 8am to10am (trail) and 8am to 1:00pm (for the walk-about),

For the Trail Poker-run to continue it will take additional club members to volunteer. The walkabout Poker run is maned by non-members and members (who graciously support the club and are generally without sleds). So those of you can't or don't actively participate in the club step up, take your turn in the barrel and man a station one day out of the year.



If you live in another state or for some other reason don't want to join a local snowmobile club you are welcome to become an OSSA only Member.

### Who Can Join?



Volunteer hours/miles = \$\$\$. More \$\$\$ = the more we can provide for snowmobiling!






# KNOW & USE HAND SIGNALS

Purpose of Communication		SUBJECT EXPERTISE
Right Turn	E.C.	Left arm raised at shoulder height, elbow bent, and forearm vertical with palm of hand flat.
Left Turn	6	Left arm extended straight out from shoulder and pointing in the direction of the turn.
Stop	RO	Arm raised from the shoulder and extended up over the head with palm of hand flat.
Slowing	4783	Left arm extended out and down from the side of the body with a downward flapping motion of hand to signal warning or caution.
Oncoming Sleds	S.	Left arm raised at shoulder height, elbow bent and forearm vertical, wrist bent, move arm from left to right over head, pointing to right side of trail.
Sleds Following		Arm raised, elbow bent with thumb pointing backward in hitch-hiking motion move arm forward to backward over your shoulder.
Last Sled in Line	5	Left arm raised at shoulder height, elbow bent and forearm vertical with hand clenched in a fist.

#### Snowmobiling Quick Facts

There are four major manufacturers that build snowmobiles. They are: Arctic Cat - Headquartered in Thief River Falls, MN; BRP - Headquartered in Valcourt, Quebec; Polaris Industries - Headquartered in Medina, MN; and Yamaha Motor Corporation – Headquartered in Ontario, Canada.

In 2023 there were 124,769 snowmobiles sold worldwide; 53,553 were sold in the U.S. and 48,252 were sold in Canada.

There are 1.26 million registered snowmobiles in the US and over 601,000 registered snowmobiles in Canada.

#### The Economic Impact of Snowmobiling

- United States—\$26 Billion annually Canada - \$9.3 billion annually Europe — \$4 billion annually
- Over 100,000 full-time jobs are generated by the snowmobile industry in North America. Those jobs are involved in manufacturing, dealerships and tourism related businesses.

#### Snowmobiler Profile

- The average age of a snowmobiler is 54 years old.
- The average snowmobiler spends \$2,500 each year on snowmobile-related recreation.
- 50% of snowmobilers trailer their snowmobiles to ride. 50% snowmobile from their primary residence or have a vacation home where they keep and use their snowmobiles.
- Snowmobilers are caring neighbors, they raised over \$3 million for charity annually.
- There are 3,000+ snowmobile clubs worldwide, involved in trail grooming, charity fund raising, & family activities.

#### Snowmobile Use

The use of snowmobiles in National Parks is regulated by federal Law Enforcement. Snowmobiling occurs on roads groomed and marked for snowmobiling, the same roadways used by recreational vehicles, cars, trucks and busses. Snowmobiles are NOT used as off road vehicles in National Parks such as Yellowstone, Rocky Mountain and Grand Teton.

On US National Forest Land, most of the trails used by snowmobiles are on groomed roads used by summer recreationists. There are also secondary and seasonal roads within the forests used by snowmobilers. These roads are groomed and marked by volunteers who work closely with the local U.S. Forest Service staff in maintaining and managing those areas.

The manufacturers have always been actively involved in promoting safe riding behavior while snowmobiling. Over one million safety related brochures and decals, and hundreds of thousands of posters and safety DVDs have been distributed free of charge to snowmobile enthusiasts throughout the world. Safety trainers, enforcement officers, Chambers of Commerce, etc. use safety materials provided by the manufacturers through the Safe Riders! You make snowmobiling safe™ safety campaign.


