In April, Dennis and I attended the ACSA (American Council of Snowmobile Associations) DC Fly-In. It had been four years since we were able to meet with legislators in DC since COVID. Day one included an ACSA Board Meeting. Day two included a morning meeting at the US Forest Service. That afternoon we heard speakers from the Bureau of Land Management, Operation Lifesaver, and Joe Gilson of Senator Grassley's office. The rest of the day was spent preparing for our meetings on Capitol Hill. Day three was spent meeting with Oregon Congressmen and Senators on the "hill". We had the opportunity to talk with them about Forest Service issues, RTP, and access for all. Each office was given information packets on snowmobile facts as well as a summary of the issues concerning snowmobilers.



In June, Dennis, Lisa Burt, and I attended the 55th Annual ISC (International Snowmobile Congress) in Moline, Illinois. Dennis and I attended ISC and ACSA meetings. Lisa Burt represented OSSA by attending IASA administrator meetings. We all attended various workshops and fundraisers benefiting snowmobiling.

We had a trail work party and campout on the weekend of June 23rd that was attended by volunteers from the club. They cleared about two miles of heavy brush and small trees along the bar ditch on the 4421 road. The week before there was a crew of about 8-9 people working all week on the 2730-240 trail which was badly in need of major brushing. We did about 37.2 miles of brushing and had put in about 224 hours on four of our trails. I would like to put out a big thank-you to Mike Hannifan, Dave Rogers, Dan Gill (Membership Director), Walt Denstedt (Club President). Brandon Beachamp (Club Secretary), Marshall Woods, Dave Mills, John Vogel, and Charles Rogers (loaned the club a mini backhoe to use).



Volunteer hours and miles Are Vital to OSSA

What is a snowmobile club volunteer?

A snowmobile club volunteer is a special person who dedicates their time, energy, and sometimes money to benefit not only their snowmobile club but others. This person is involved, helpful, charitable, selfless and always humble. Much of the time, the public has no idea what our volunteers do. So, let us share just a few things that they do.

They voluntarily maintain over 31,500 miles of multi-use trail each year. These trails benefit not only snowmobilers but crosscountry skiers, snow bikers, snow-shoers, and dog sledders. In the spring and fall, volunteers are busy cleaning trails and putting up trail markers to get ready for the next season. They cut wood and fill the shelters for all to use. They build bridges, shelters, re-roof existing grooming sheds, and do their own maintenance on their sno-cats. They voluntarily teach snowmobile safety classes and avalanche safety classes. 
Anyone who enjoys the outdoors can be a member including cross country skiers, snow shoers, dog sledders, snow bikers and of course snowmobilers.



We expect to have a club ride every weekend this winter of some sort from mid December through March, but be sure to check our Facebook Page for updates on rides and locations.



2024 KEN HAEVERNICK OSSA SCHOLARSHIP

OSSA scholarship is available to either graduating high school seniors or a person currently enrolled in a college or trade school full time (12 semester credits), either physically or online. Scholarships will be given to the winners regardless of other grants or scholarships that the students may receive.

Requirements are as follows:

- 1. The applicant or immediate family must be a paid member of Oregon State Snowmobile Association.
- 2. The applicant must submit the completed application form.
- 3. The applicant must submit a cover letter. This letter must include the student ID number and college/trade school name and the address to which a scholarship check would be sent.
- 4. The applicant must submit a resume detailing his/her involvement in snowmobiling as well as extra-curricular/volunteer activities.
- 5. The applicant must include an essay (essay subject on the application form). The essay MUST follow the format below to be accepted and should be sent in Word or Google Docs:
 - a. Minimum of 2 pages typed.
 - b. Double-spaced.
 - c. Font Times New Roman.
 - d. Font size -12 point.
 - e. Margins set to 1 inch for all margins (top, bottom, left side, right side).
 - f. Page numbers (if included) should be .5 inch from the top of the page (not within the 1" margin).
 - g. A header (for example, the essay question) can be added 1 inch from the top of the first page, and then enter a double space to begin your essay.
 - h. Do NOT use bold-faced type or other special settings.
 - i. If work is cited, add an additional "work-cited" page at the end of the essay. This information will NOT be counted as part of the 2-page minimum.
- 6. The applicable documents must be received via email at the OSSA Office by February 1, 2024. Please email to Lmahoney@oregonsnow.org using a subject line of OSSA Scholarship Application.
- 7. Any entry that does not meet ALL of these requirements will be disqualified. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Additional rules:

- 1. Students must use the scholarship within one year of receiving it.
- 2. All scholarship checks will be written directly to the college and not to the student. NO EXCEPTIONS.

All applicants will be notified of the final scholarship selection by April 15, 2024. The scholarship winner will be publicly announced at the OSSA Board Meeting in May 2024.

Snowmobiling Quick Facts

There are four major manufacturers that build snowmobiles. They are: Arctic Cat – Headquartered in Thief River Falls, MN; BRP – Headquartered in Valcourt, Quebec; Polaris Industries – Headquartered in Medina, MN; and Yamaha Motor Corporation – Headquartered in Ontario, Canada.

In 2023 there were 124,769 snowmobiles sold worldwide; 53,553 were sold in the U.S. and 48,252 were sold in Canada.

There are 1.26 million registered snowmobiles in the US and over 601,000 registered snowmobiles in Canada.

The Economic Impact of Snowmobiling

- United States—\$26 Billion annually Canada—\$9.3 billion annually Europe—\$4 billion annually
- Over 100,000 full-time jobs are generated by the snowmobile industry in North America. Those jobs are involved in manufacturing, dealerships and tourism related businesses.

Snowmobiler Profile

- The average age of a snowmobiler is 54 years old.
- The average snowmobiler spends \$2,500 each year on snowmobile-related recreation.
- 50% of snowmobilers trailer their snowmobiles to ride. 50% snowmobile from their primary residence or have a vacation home where they keep and use their snowmobiles.
- · Snowmobilers are caring neighbors, they raised over \$3 million for charity annually.
- There are 3,000+ snowmobile clubs worldwide, involved in trail grooming, charity fund raising, & family activities.
- · There are over 42 registered non-profit associations representing snowmobilers in the US, Canada, Europe.
- Snowmobiling is great exercise bringing people outdoors interacting with nature and each other. It is an invigorating sport, great for stress release and good mental health.

Snowmobile Use

The use of snowmobiles in National Parks is regulated by federal Law Enforcement. Snowmobiling occurs on roads groomed and marked for snowmobiling, the same roadways used by recreational vehicles, cars, trucks and busses. Snowmobiles are NOT used as off road vehicles in National Parks such as Yellowstone, Rocky Mountain and Grand Teton.

On US National Forest Land, most of the trails used by snowmobiles are on groomed roads used by summer recreationists. There are also secondary and seasonal roads within the forests used by snowmobilers. These roads are groomed and marked by volunteers who work closely with the local U.S. Forest Service staff in maintaining and managing those areas.

The manufacturers have always been actively involved in promoting safe riding behavior while snowmobiling. Over one million safety related brochures and decals, and hundreds of thousands of posters and safety DVDs have been distributed free of charge to snowmobile enthusiasts throughout the world. Safety trainers, enforcement officers, Chambers of Commerce, etc. use safety materials provided by the manufacturers through the **Safe Riders! You make snowmobiling safe™ safety campaign**.





