Pictured to the left is MJSC member Kelly Fough spreading hay on fire damaged soil from the fire on the banks of North Santiam river. Story: On 10 Oct the Linn County Sheriff's SAR team notified the MJSC SAR team that assistance was needed to haul hay and spread it along the fire damaged banks of the North Santiam River to stop containment's from destroyed structures flowing into the river with heavy rains arriving the same weekend. Eleven club members responded with five vehicles and trailers to transport fifty pound hay bales to river banks behind the damaged structures.

Many damaged structures were built within five feet from the rivers edge. Home owners in advance had to approve permission for Deputies and MJSC volunteers to gain access to the river banks. With Deputies and club members working together all requests for soil stabilization we're met. Many more days of support will follow this weekends request with teams moving to the town of Detroit once effected home owners can reach their damaged homes, Deputies are concerned with contaminants reaching Detroit Lake. Both Detroit Lake and North Santiam River feed the Salem water supply.

As we all know, many areas of the Rogue Valley (Medford, Phoenix, Talent, Ashland, Eagle Point and Shady Cove) were destroyed by wildfires at the beginning of September.

With their community devastated and so many families displaced, the Rogue Snowmobilers jumped into action to help those affected by the fires (over 2500 homes were destroyed).

Members of the Rogue Snowmobilers Club, including all board members and officers, donated \$1,030.00 to the Fire Relief Fundraiser which the Club then matched dollar for dollar, bringing the total to \$2,060.00. In partnership with Rogue Credit Union members, that total was then matched dollar for dollar by the not for profit financial institution, raising the grand total to \$4,120!

This is just another of the many ways that snowmobilers display their kindness and generosity, on and off the mountain. Fund raising was organized by Mark & Julie Conner. Additionally Mark contributed to this article.

D&S Harley, Phoenix, Oregon was a complete loss in the recent Almeda fire here in southern Oregon. Their plans are to rebuild. They have invited us to have our meetings there again when they are done with construction.

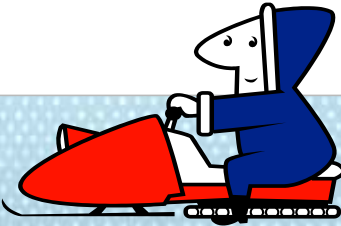
