World Champion Dave McClure Key Note Speaker at OSSA Convention



Dave McClure is an eight-time World Champion Hillclimb Racer, 10-time Year-End RMSHA Points Champion, holds two King of the Hill titles in the RMSHA Circuit and has competed in the X-Games. He's now a dedicated KLIM backcountry rider, and his noteworthy 12-year racing career spanned from 2006 until 2018, when he stopped racing due to an injury. KLIM originally sponsored him from 2006 to 2012.

With this new sponsorship, Dave McClure has earned himself a place on the coveted KLIM Backcountry Team, an elite group of riders hand-picked by KLIM for their skill, passion and dedication to the sport. He's also an Arctic Cat Factory Blackcat Rider and a member of the Fox Backcountry Team.

Dave McClure will be the keynote speaker Saturday night at the banquet. This season is Diamond Lake Resort's 100th anniversary.

For two winters 2018-2019 and 2019-2020, I was a lead snowmobile guide in McCall, Idaho at CM Backcountry Rentals and Adventures. For the winter of 2020-21 I raced in the Rock Mountain States Hill Climb Association. I made 6/7 races for the series and ended up top 15 in semi pro improved stock and open mod. There was a new members class that I was mod champion at the Afton hill climb.

I look forward to participating in the OSSA 50th Convention in 2022, I will conduct riding classes, avalanche practice sessions and lead private group clinics. It will be a blast and I'm looking forward to seeing you all!

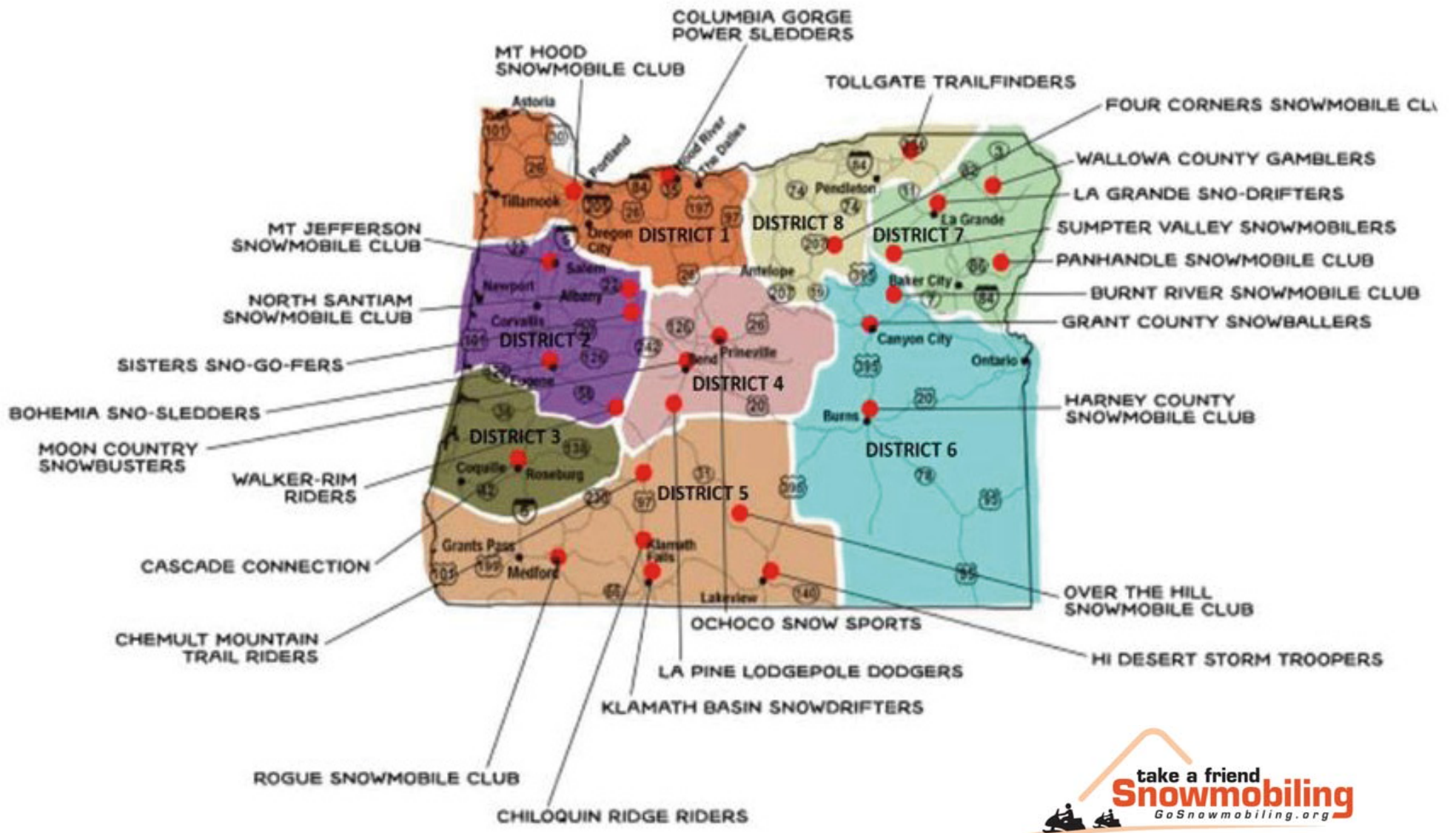

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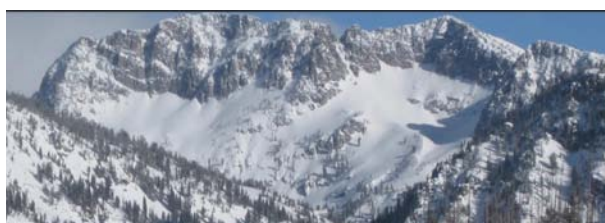

George Gregory is heading up a crew to repair the stove pipe at the Brown Mountain Shelter. The club voted that we will cover the cost of the

materials to do the repairs. Please keep an eye out for emails regarding updates for all of our upcoming work parties.

We have made contact **Luke Youngberg** about coming down to our area for a back-country skills riding clinic. He is interested in doing this, but he needs to wait until his racing schedule is released to let us know what dates would work for him.

We may need to change the club ride and radar run that is scheduled with the Chiloquin Ridge Riders as we just realized it is scheduled for the same weekend as the **Mt. Bailey 3000 Poker Run**. We will keep you updated on the dates and status of these events when we know more information.

We decided that we would be willing to be in charge of one day of guided rides and a meal as part of the 2022 OSSA Convention at Diamond Lake. We will do this together with the Chiloquin Ridge Riders. Dan Riblett will contact Dennis Jordan to find out more details on the convention so that we can make our plans.

We are very pleased to report that our club reached 107 family memberships by the end of the season last year. We are off to a great start this season with 58 paid memberships as of October 12th. Grant County Snowballers

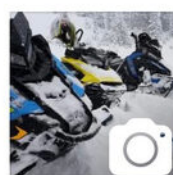
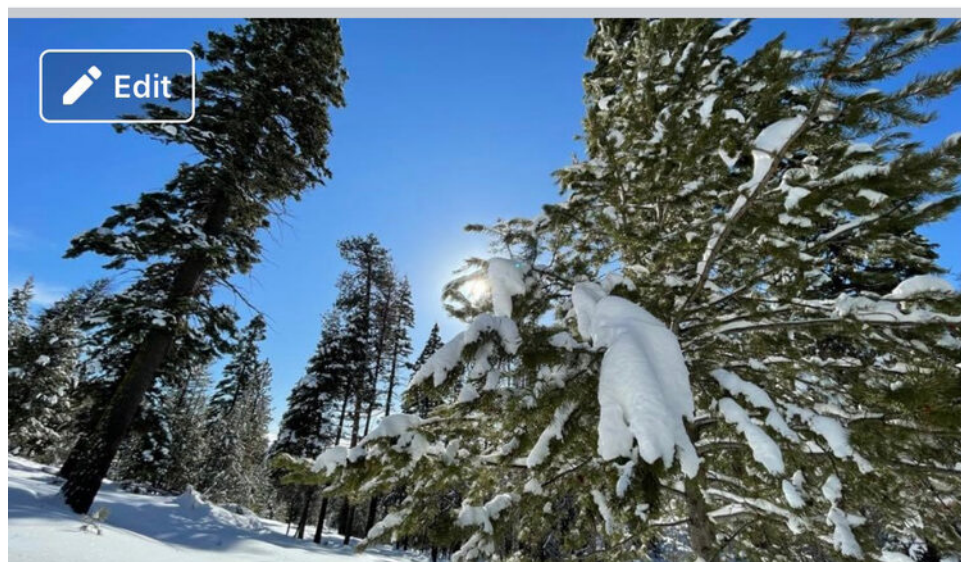

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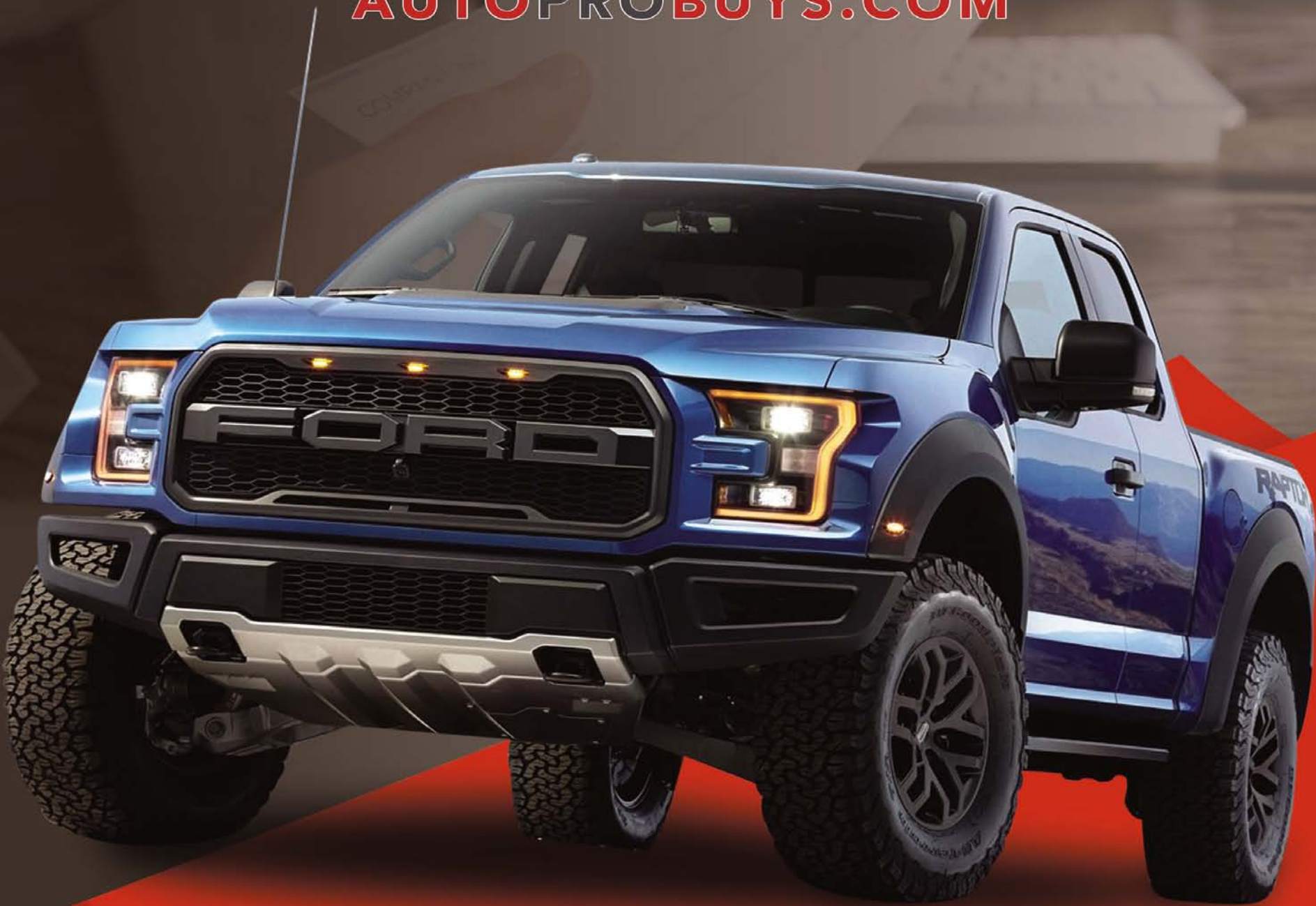


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Snowmobiler Hand Signals

Approved ACSA Snowmobiling Hand Signals

Hand signals are easy to use and can be a very reliable way to communicate while riding a snowmobile. They can be vital to safe snowmobile riding, so always make clear, very deliberate signals with your left arm that can be seen by other drivers behind you or on approaching sleds.

Stop



Left arm is raised from the shoulder and extended straight up over the head with palm of hand flat. Note that some riders may indicate the STOP signal by extending their right arm instead of their left since the left hand is used for braking; therefore watch for and be prepared to stop for either signal.

Left Turn



Left arm extended straight out from the shoulder to point in the direction of the turn.

Right Turn



Bend your left arm at the elbow to shoulder height; with your hand pointing straight up and your palm flat, your arm should make a right angle.

Oncoming Sleds



Guide your snowmobile to the right while pointing to the right side of trail over your head, signaling to riders behind you that they should make sure they are riding on the right half of the trail and are yielding to on-coming traffic.

Slowing



Left arm extended out and down from the side of the body with a downward flapping motion of hand to signal warning or caution.

Sleds Following



Left arm is raised with elbow bent; with thumb pointing backward in hitchhiking motion, move arm forward to backward over your shoulder to advise approaching riders there are other sleds behind you in your group. Note that many riders may instead raise a number of spread fingers to indicate how many sleds are following in their group (if five or more, simply hold all five fingers up with fingers spread, or flash multiples of five). If traffic is heavy or if you're riding in the middle of a large group that is spaced fairly close together (next sled is clearly visible directly behind your sled), it is best to keep both hands on the handlebars and concentrate on driving your own snowmobile versus worrying about this signal since it should be quite obvious that other sleds are following.

Last Sled in Line



Left arm is raised at shoulder height, elbow bent and forearm vertical with hand clenched in a fist; important signal used to advise approaching riders that you are the last sled in your group.
