The Klamath Basin Snowdrifters and the Chiloquin Ridge Riders hosted the 2021 OSSA convention rides this year in and around the Klamath Basin. This year was a little different due to mandated social distancing rules that were in place during the time of the rides. Due to these mandates, the OSSA directed that going forward with the event, in person, indoor meetings would be canceled; this included the indoor banquet, movie night, OSSA meetings and any after ride social events. With this mandate, the host clubs overhauled the plans for the rides and the convention and provided a world class event.

The event became a “rider” centric event. Mountain Skills / Avy orientation on Thursday and Friday with Luke Yougberg and a Levi Lavallee ride on Friday

Recent Avalanches

The past few days have been the deadliest week of US avalanches on record. So far in February, there have been avalanche related deaths in Alaska, California, Colorado, Utah, Montana, New Hampshire and Washington. One of the avalanches occurred near Cle Elum, WA involving an off duty WSP

Trooper. Trooper Steve Houle was a 28 year veteran of the WSP. Houle was riding his snow bike near French Cabin Creek around 11am when the slide happened burying him and his riding partner. Fortunately, his partner was able to dig himself out and notify authorities. Unfortunately, Houle was not found until 7pm which was much too late. This is a stark reminder of why each of us should get avalanche training and avalanche gear. The gear does us no good if we do not know how to use it. All of us are itching to hit the powder. This is especially the case this year due to the erratic snow season we've had. Time to use our avalanche training or get some asap.

This will be a full day on the snow reading snow conditions, terrain, weather as well as hands on training of beacon, probe, shovel and airbag use. New Groomer Shed At Idlewild SnoPark



After years of hard work, persistence, and collaboration, the groomer shed is now a reality.

The Malheur National Forest would like to thank the Harney County Snowmobile Club (HCSC) for their initiative and hard work to fund and build a groomer shed at the Idlewild SnoPark. The groomer can cover up to 75 miles.



The HCSC applied for an Oregon Parks and Recreation grant in 2016. In 2017, they were awarded \$160,000 to purchase materials and construct a 40 feet by 60 feet building to house their snowmobile trail groomer.

Construction began in August of 2020 and was completed on Aug. 29, 2020. However, it took years of planning and preparation before ground was broken. The project began on June 7, 2018 with a letter of support followed by a letter of intent before applications could be submitted and approved. Then another year passed before the final approval to move forward occurred.



The new groomer shed was completed Aug. 29, 2020.

Through the hard work of the HCSC volunteers, Tim Holly, Ryan DeLange, Oregon State Snowmobile Association (OSSA) Director District 6, and many inter-workings on logistics and other details, the groomer shed is now a reality. Having the groomer housed at the Idlewild SnoPark will allow ongoing grooming of the 150 miles of snowmobile trails accessible from the SnoPark, which provides a paved parking area and a restroom.

The groomer can cover up to 75 miles, depending on snow conditions. Storing the vehicle at the SnoPark will now provide for grooming on the west side of highway 395 on old trails that haven't been groomed in past years, opening up to 300 miles of trails for snowmobile enthusiasts.

Thank you, Harney County Snowmobile Club for your persistence and hard work to see this project to fruition. The new groomer shed will be a welcome addition to facilitate snowmobile trail grooming and winter recreation on the Malheur National Forest.



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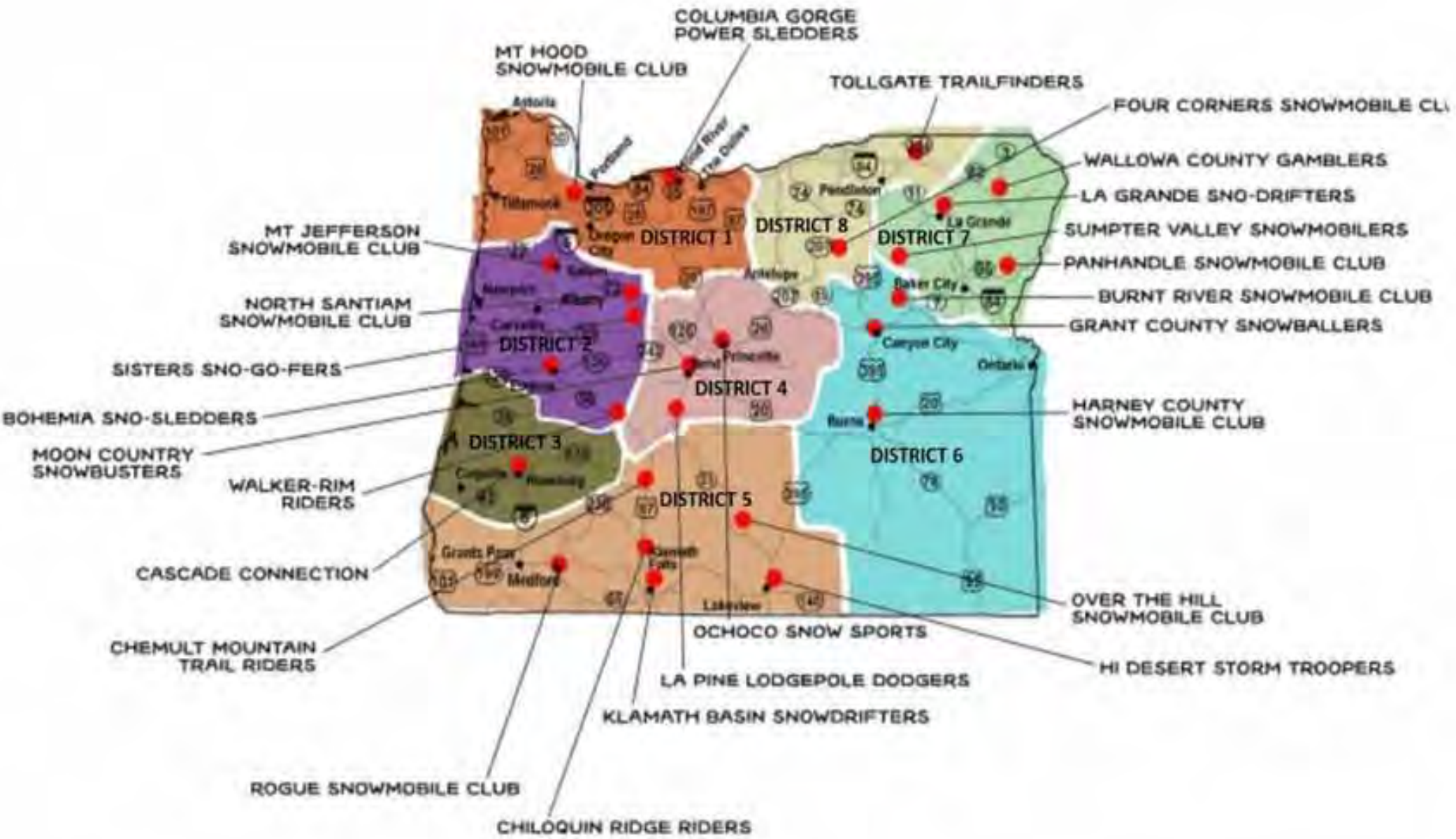

On Wednesday, 27 Jan 2021, the MJSC SAR team provided snowmobile riding training to US Forest Service Outdoor Recreation Staff and Marion County Sheriff Office SAR Team members from the basics to intermediate riding skills. For some, this was a refresher on some skills but for many it was the first organized training they had received. The instruction was geared toward first responders being called out to assist while working in their respective FS districts. The new soft snow allowed them to experience different terrain, recovering stuck sleds, riding off packed trails and riding techniques. The turn out was good, we had five FS personnel from four different districts, four Deputies from MCSO SAR and eight MJSC SAR volunteers to teach and provide riding experiences.

More training will be provided in the future on transporting individuals and riding in deeper snow once we get more snow. Besides the training MJSC leadership had the time to communicate to all parties some of the difficulties everyone is having with crowds on the trails and parking lots. Nothing better than being out of the office or conference room and meeting on the snow under blue skies and fresh snow to talk about snowmobiling in the great outdoors.

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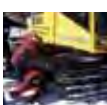

POKER RUN 2021



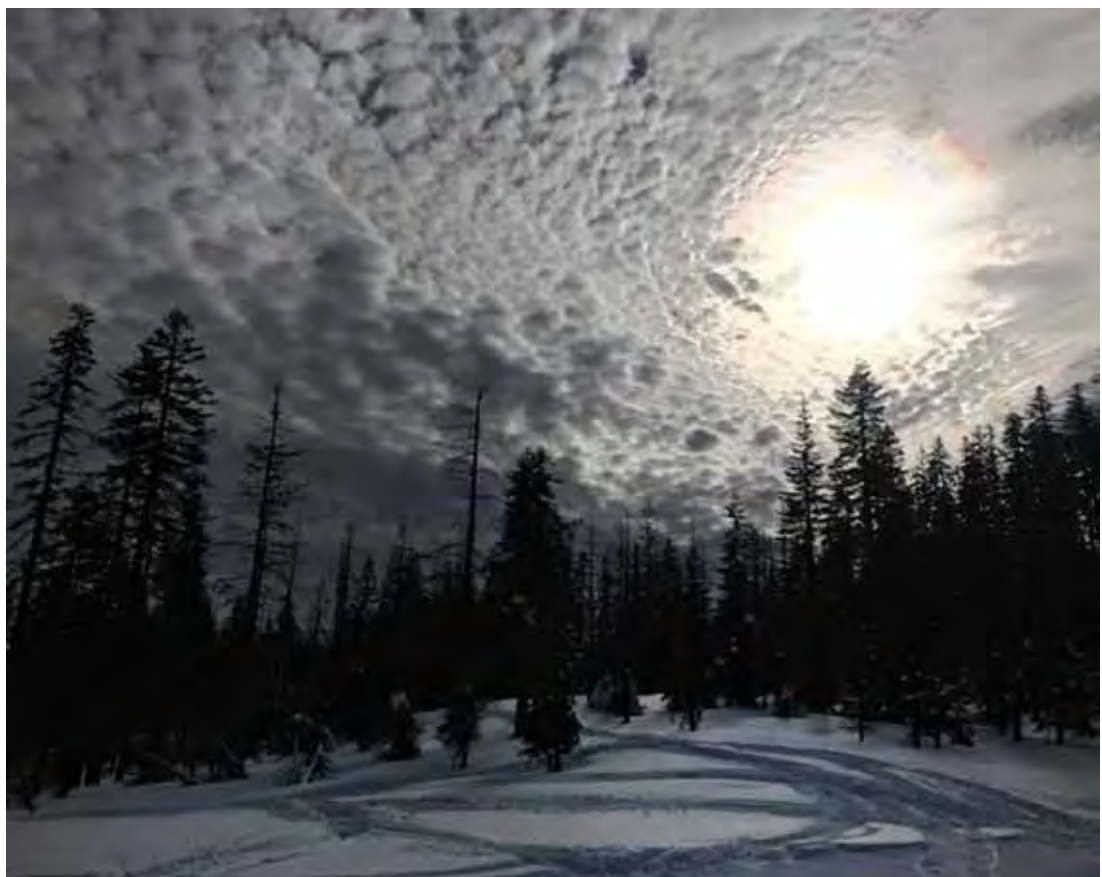
